2008 8-Ball Southwest Challenge

(March 27-30, 2008) Riviera Hotel & Casino, Las Vegas -

Three South OC APA teams competed in the 13th Annual 8-Ball Southwest Challenge. Players enjoyed competition among 233 three-person teams from regional league areas in California, Arizona, Nevada and New Mexico.

Any APA member in the southwest region was eligible to compete in the mini tournaments that were run alongside the main event. Tournament entry fees ranged from \$10 and \$20 for individual events and \$40 for doubles events, with **100% cash payback** for 1st -3rd Place finishers.

Local singles qualifier tournaments were also run with Diana Nunn and Max Ahmadi from the South OC APA winning their tournament boards. They will compete along with other local

qualifiers from South OC in the Fall Regional on Oct 4-5 for a chance to qualify for the National Singles Championship in Vegas! 2008 National Singles Championship



This annual event consists of two individual National Singles

Championships: 8-Ball Classic and 9-Ball Shootout.

Competition is played on 7' tables using a modified single elimination format that allows every person the opportunity to play at least twice before being eliminated. All nationally qualified players receive free lodging (based on double occupancy) and travel assistance, compliments of the APA. Players in these events compete in Skill Level Tiers, and competition is open to both men and women.

Watch national qualifiers compete, play in mini tournaments as an APA member and visit various billiard vendor booths within the tournament rooms.

Administrative Stuff

MEMBERSHIP CARDS

Unless you've joined in the last week, all membership cards have been distributed in the team packets. Please check your packet thoroughly and contact the league office if you have not received your card. This will come in handy when you go to nationals and play in the mini tournaments...otherwise you'll have to pay a whole 5 dollars to get a temporary card!

HOW IS THE TOP GUN SCORE CALCULATED?

Top Gun Points were originally the sum of your opponents' skill levels for the matches you've won. Using Bill Toy's logic, effective this Spring '08 session, your **Top Gun Score** is now a combination of your *Win Percentage* multiplied by the *Top Gun Points*.

Rules of the Month

CUE BALL FOULS

Exercise caution when picking up or placing the cue ball in a ball-in-hand situation. The cue ball is always alive. If the cue ball, **or the hand holding or moving it**, touches another ball it is a cue ball foul and your opponent has **ball-in-hand**. Be especially careful when you are picking up or placing the cue ball in a tight spot.

SPLITTING TABLES / MATCHES

Occasionally, lengthy matches make is logical to put a second table in action, if one is available (regardless of table size). So, if the **fourth match** has not started by **official League time** (5 PM on Sundays and 7 PM on any other league night) **plus two hours**, then it would begin on the second table. The fifth match would then be played on whichever table becomes available first. Splitting matches is waived if both teams want to continue on one table. Refer to page 24-25 of the Official Team Manual.

TABLE SIZE / EQUIPMENT

The home team gets the choice of which table to use for league play, regardless of table size. They may also select which cue ball to use, and this cue ball must be used for all matches played on the selected table.
