2009 National Singles Championship April 29 - May 2

The annual National Singles Championship (NSC) consists of two individual tournaments held annually at the Riviera Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas: the 8-Ball Classic and the 9-Ball Shootout. The South OC will be represented by the winners of the 2008 Fall Regional and the recent 2009 Spring Regional held at the Pen in Huntington Beach.



2009 Spring Singles Regional (March 7-8, 2009) - The regional tournament is the second step in a three-step process to earn a spot in the NSC. Over twenty South OC APA players competed against two other league areas in one of the four California regional tournaments, with a total of 72 8-ball players and 47 9-ball players. Matches ran all day Saturday and most of Sunday and after all the dust cleared South County took five of the ten national qualifier spots, along with two runners-up. In other words, South OC APA kicked some butt and will be representing all skill level tiers and the NSC! Congrats to the following National Qualifiers: Baron Domey (9-ball SL 5), Lisa Larson (9-ball SL 3), Preston Strait (8-ball SL 5), Bill Toy (8-ball SL 6) and Eli Veach (9-ball SL 6). They will join the national qualifiers from the 2008 Fall Regional: Cesar Brandes (9-ball SL 7), Adam Fukushima (9-ball SL 5), and Eli Veach (8-ball SL 6).

Jack & Jill Doubles Qualifier (March 21) Coconuts Café -In conjunction with the two national singles events, the APA runs the annual Jack & Jill 8-Ball Championship, with one team from South OC representing from the Doubles Qualifier Tournament. Starting early on a Saturday morning, fourteen doubles teams played in this co-ed Scotch doubles modified single elimination event. With many good matches along the way, a surprise team



snuck up on everyone as Sam Bernal and Korinda Godwin knocked out the competition one-by-one until they ran into the eventual runner-up Darin & Nicol Reeves. Steve Styck and Dani Lachapelle had some memorable ball in hand moments given they were not ball in hand fouls...the brain is a terrible thing to waste. Probably the craziest match of the tournament was when Robbin Styck and Sean McElligott worked themselves out of a hole to get to hill/hill versus the eventual champs Bill Toy and Meghan Knox, only to scratch on the 8-ball... haven't we all been there?...aaaahhhh. Bill and Meghan went on to defeat Darin and Nicol in the finals to earn the national slot. Since Bill will be playing in the National Singles event at the same time as the doubles tournament, Simon Trumper will team up with Meghan in the doubles tournament...good luck!

2009 8-Ball Southwest Challenge

(March 12-15, 2009) Riviera Hotel & Casino, Las Vegas - The

South OC APA started the Southwest Challenge (SWC) with nine teams, our strongest showing by far over the last few SWC events. With over ten league areas and 187 teams, we started strong in the first round when five teams went 10-0, not even losing a single match-up. After a



long weekend, other areas knew we were in the house as we finished strong as a group. Three teams finished in 97th place out of the money, with one team member going old school with a behind the back shot like something out of the hustler (...you know who you are!). Three more teams finished in 33rd place and made their team entry fee back.

The final three teams finished on the final board of eight teams with two of those teams finishing in **5th place**, each team winning \$750:

The Southwest Challenge is a 3-person team tournament consisting of teams from the southwest region in the states of CA, NV, AZ and NM. It is held twice a year, once for 8-ball in the spring and once for 9-ball in the fall. Any active APA member in this area can participate in this pre-registered event. Rule of the Month

POSTING HIGH-RATED PLAYERS

(In 9-Ball League only) No more than two senior skill level players (SL 6-9) may play in any given team match. If an ineligible (by this rule) player is chosen to play, then a violation of this rule officially occurs when the balls are broken in that player's match. The ineligible player forfeits the match and the teams go on to the next player match. Both players' skill levels count towards the 23-Rule for that match. On the other hand, once the team match is over and either team has left the match site, or the scoresheets are signed by both Team Captains, the match would stand as played even if an ineligible player has competed.
